LEADERSHIP DAY CHALLENGES US FOR 2024 AND BEYOND

To teach and inspire women who wear red, TFRW's 2024 Leadership Day offered amazing insight into efforts and actions in this election year that is so crucial for America's future.

Leadership Day was Friday and Saturday, Jan. 26-27, at the Sheraton Georgetown Hotel and Conference Center. Its focus was to provide members of Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) with guidance for their hometown chapters.

Keynote speaker at the weekend event was former Texas Governor Rick Perry, who first assumed the top posi-

tion in Texas on December 21, 2000 when Governor George Bush vacated the office to announce his candidacy and campaign for President of the United States. Governor Perry first won the office in his own right by garnering 58% of the vote in the 2002 gubernatorial election.

During his speech at the Leadership Conference, Governor Perry reflected upon how important TFRW had been to that campaign more than two decades ago. He praised the "women in red," adding that the solid backing and hard work from TFRW were crucial to his win.

Governor Perry's accolades on TFRW also served as incentive for what lies ahead. He urged us to get involved amid demands of the 2024 election year. And so, as your hometown president, I encourage all Lubbock Area Republican Women to help, work and bond to save this nation. Do something for your own generation and for those to come!

From easy tasks to complicated ones, consider these urgent jobs like door knocking, block walking, phone calling, letter writing, texting, and other ways that urge citizens to get out and vote!

It can be scary that so many solid, conservative values are at stake. Yet it also strengthens and comforts us to work toward changes for the better in City, State and Country.

THE FAMILIES' RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES ACT

On January 10, 2024, the Families' Rights and Responsibilities Act (S.3571/ H.R.6934) was introduced by Senator Tim Scott (R-N.C.), Senator James Lankford (R-Okla.), and Representative Virginia Foxx (R-N.C.). The Families' Rights and Responsibilities Act will ensure parents the fundamental right to direct the upbringing of their children. The Act will guarantee this fundamental right is not ignored or overruled by government officials simply because the government disagrees with the parents. This Act will also protect parents' rights to choose schools and make medical decisions for their children

The Family Policy Alliance is asking Americans to call their Representative and ask them to cosponsor H.R.6934. Getting as many cosponsors on the bill as possible will help to obtain the votes needed in the

House for it to pass.

If you would like to see this Act become a law, please call Representative Jodey Arrington and ask him to co-sponsor H.R.6934.
